


Besides the disposal service, AAA offers a recycling and transfer business

and these are the green and yellow trucks seen throughout our communities.

Buckner Post Office Hours have changed!

For those of you who may not have noticed the Post Office located in Buckner, MO. on Washington Street has changed their hours of operation.

The new hours are: Monday-Friday, 9am-11 am, 1pm-4pm and they close at 4 pm. Saturday, 9am-11am and closed Sunday. The post office box area, located in the lobby is still open 24/7.

If you need to use the post office services during different hours other area post office hours are as follows: Levasy Post Office, located on Main Street in Levasy, MO. is open from 8am-12 noon Monday-Friday, Saturday 8am-10am and closed on Sunday. Sibley Post Office Hours are Monday-Friday, 1pm-5pm, Saturday 10:30am-12:30pm and closed Sunday.

As you can see all locations are within approximately a 3 mile radius and one of above Post Offices is open between 8am and 12 noon, closed 12 noon to 1 (lunch time) and open until 5 pm Monday through Friday. All are full service post offices. All are closed on major holidays. (So it is very convenient to use one of the 3 post offices.)

Planet Aid has two containers in the Buckner area. One is located on the corner of 24 highway and BB, next to Misty's. Another one is located on the corner of South Hudson Street and Lake City Road, right by the railroad tracks and across from the Police Department.

Planet Aid collects clothes and shoes and distributes them to people in need.

Both are excellent places to drop off used clothing, shoes and non breakable household items.

Jackson County COMBAT Awards Anti-Violence Funding December 9, 2013

Today, officials with Jackson County **COMBAT** (Community Backed Anti-Drug Tax) announced that they have allocated \$540,000 in funding next year to local agencies who are engaging in efforts to help address violent crime throughout the community. The funding was approved at this afternoon's meeting of the Jackson County Legislature."This funding will help address many of the reoccurring issues we see with violent crime throughout our community," said Jackson County Executive Mike Sanders. "But this is just a beginning. All of us must continue to look for new and innovative strategies to reduce and prevent the unacceptable levels of violence that continues to take place in our neighborhoods." COMBAT is funded through a one-quarter cent countywide sales tax. Since first being passed in 1989, COMBAT funds have traditionally been awarded to agencies focused on substance abuse treatment and drug prevention.In September, COMBAT officials announced a plan to also begin funding agencies that specifically work to address various anti-violence strategies in Jackson County. A request for proposals was released, asking for innovative projects that addressed specific issues with violent crime in the

community, including gang violence, relationship violence, preventing violence among ex-offenders, restorative justice, and parenting and family interventions, among others. Over 130 individuals showed up to the two pre- bid meetings that were held and a total of 36 groups applied for the new anti-violence funding. Those who were awarded funding for anti-violence efforts include: Rose Brooks Center: \$35,000Lee's Summit Cares: \$25,000Ad Hoc Group Against Crime: \$40,000City of Sugar Creek: \$29,000Heartland Center for Behavioral Change: \$35,000Kansas City Crime Commission (2nd Chance Program): \$35,000Arts \$25,000Freedom Tech: School Initiative (Mt. Pleasant Education): \$41,000Boys & Girls Club of Greater KC: \$40,000Mattie Rhodes Counseling Center: \$46,000Jackson County Family Court: \$50,000Dismas House of KC: \$50,000ReStart, Inc.: \$24,000Community Mediation: \$45,000Full Employment Council: \$20,000 The expanded anti-violence efforts undertaken by COMBAT will not affect funding levels for drug treatment and prevention, which will remain a focus of the agency. Jackson County Passes 2014 Budget December 9, 2013

During today's last scheduled meeting of the year, the Jackson County Legislature officially adopted the county's operating budget for 2014. The \$296.3 million budget is \$3.9 million less than 2013 and marks the seventh straight year that the county budget has been reduced. The 2014 budget includes no increase to the county property tax levy. Other highlights include funding for renovations to the Jackson County Courthouse Annex in Independence

and relocation and renovation of the Jackson County Sheriff's Office headquarters. "This budget is an example of the sensible and fiscally responsible government we have built in Jackson County," said County Executive Mike Sanders. "Rather than asking the citizens for more, we instead have committed ourselves to hard work, collaboration, and innovation in order to meet the challenges we face today as well as the priorities that we must address for our future."






