
Retiring in style


Bambi's Story by Carla Gilbert

I love to watch television and love it when they have commercials that have dogs or cats in them. I always have to jump up to go and bark at them. One thing I don't understand though is how quickly they can disappear and I don't know where they go. I keep watching maybe I'll figure it out yet. I am also the guard of the house. Don't ring the doorbell or knock on the door and lord help you if you just walk in. I am the first one there showing all my teeth and raised hair on my back. I am one mean machine. I don't allow anyone to come in and with the entire ruckus I get help from Bob. Baby just wants to lick them to death – me - well no licks. Mom has to put us in our crates. Dad told us that he didn't want any cats on our back patio so he let us chase them back to the barn. Mom does not approve of us chasing the cats and keeps a very watchful eye on us when we go outside. Of course we all sleep in their bed and all have a certain spot. Don't let anyone get our spots or the war is on. My dad passed away three months ago and I have missed him terribly. It has really been hard even though mom is great and I wouldn't trade her for anything I still miss my dad. He treated me like the royalty that I am and I always watched out for him. I could tell when he was not feeling good and paid special attention. Mom took me to his grave but it is still hard to realize I will never ever see him again. We have to remember to give love to our family and friends everyday as we never know how soon our life or theirs will come to the end. And when they are




