

Break-ins on the rise in Levasy, Mo.

When I think of Levasy, I think of a quiet little community, just off 24 highway, comprised of young families and retired families as well. It's a friendly little community. There aren't many businesses left in the farming community, but it still has a City Hall, Mayor, Aldermen and a City Clerk.

In the past 3-5 weeks there has been three break-ins and two robberies.

All three of the break-ins were committed in houses that were vacant. At this time the amount of items missing is undetermined. The two robberies were committed on the water exchange (pictured to the left). Individuals come here to get water in their water tanks usually carried on the back of their trucks or trailers. It only takes quarters. The first break-in, approximately 80 dollars in quarters were taken. A heavy chain and lock were placed on the collection box. Robbers came a second time, cut the chain and robbed the box again.





Truman Road to Be Reduced to Single Lanes During Stone Arch Bridge Repairs

Beginning October 8, 2013, Truman Road will be reduced to one lane in each direction at Blue Ridge Boulevard to accommodate improvements to the Stone Arch Bridge. The lanes will only be reduced during non-peak hours, approximately 9:00 a.m. to 3:00 p.m.

Blue Ridge Boulevard will close entirely over Truman Road in mid-October, and will remain closed for the duration of the project, which is expected to

be completed in early December.

Improvements call for the roadway over the bridge to be replaced and for the parapet walls to be recapped. A wrought iron fence will be added atop the bridge walls to enhance safety for walkers and bicyclists. Sealant will be applied to the exposed stone faces of the bridge to help extend the life of the structure. Lights will be added to showcase the face of the bridge at night.

The Stone Arch Bridge forms the divide between unincorporated Jackson County and Independence. Jackson County Public Works drew up the plans with consideration for the Truman Road Green Gateway project, which is currently in the early stages of design. The corridor study is partially funded by a grant from the Mid-America Regional Council. Gunter Construction Company is the contractor on the Stone Arch Bridge project.

Detours on Blue Ridge Boulevard will be marked appropriately.

at approximately 4 PM, the sheriff's office received a call on a burglary in progress. The location of the incident was in the 40200 block of E. Campbell Road north of Oak Grove, Missouri.

The suspects were reportedly seen burglarizing the home and confronted by a relative of the homeowner. According to the witness, as the suspects were leaving, they attempted to run him over. He then shot toward the suspects.

A deputy was near I-70 and M-291 when he observed the suspect vehicle heading north on M-291. After a short pursuit, the deputy was able to take the male suspect into custody.

At the same time, sheriff's deputies received information a female had been

dropped off at a local hospital with a gunshot wound.

We have been able to confirm the female was involved in the burglary. Therefore, both suspects are in custody. The male was not injured.
